



Text Message Scam Alert!

Fraudsters are now targeting cell phone users with a new type of scam—via text message.

Here's how it works: You receive an unexpected text urging you to call a number about an issue with your account. Once you call, the scammer tries to collect sensitive information like your account number or PIN.

Be cautious with unsolicited texts.

Delete any suspicious messages right away—and if possible, permanently remove them from your device. Some scammers even use spyware in combination with these messages to access your personal data.

These scams can compromise your personally identifiable information and give criminals access to your credit union accounts—especially if you manage them through your phone.

Remember: *Southwest 66 Credit Union will NEVER ask for personal information through a text message.*
